

GENERAL INFORMATION



HOTEL DORPAT

Hotel Dorpat is located in Tartu city centre, in the middle of the main business area. The hotel is also an easy stroll from the Old Town and major shopping centres. Many rooms enjoy views over the city or the Emajõgi River – scenes of Tartu you'll never forget! The competition venue is located 1,4 kilometres away and takes about 15 minutes to walk.



SOHO Hotel

Located in the centre of Tartu, SOHO is a hub bringing together anyone from family and friends to various other groups of visitors for a truly memorable time. Guests can also stay overnight in one of 59 rooms and dine in style. All the beds in the rooms are separable SOHO is ideal for anyone who loves a great location.

TRANSPORT


Transportation to Tartu will be organised from the official point of entry (TLL – Tallinn Lennart Meri Airport). During the competition public transportation in Tartu will be free of charge with the WUC Powerlifting 2024 accreditation card. Accommodation and competition venues are all within walking distance and the Organising Committee encourages all participants to choose the more environmentally friendly option for means of transportation during the games.

VISA

Visa-free travel from countries of the European Union, the European Economic Area and the Schengen area. Short-term visa-free travel for citizens of third countries and holders of diplomatic, service, official and special passports.

CATERING

Buffet-style meals will be provided in both accommodation sites. The menu will be the same for both accommodation sites throughout the competition. Refreshments will be available in the competition venue during competition days.

FEES & ELIGIBILITY

The cost of participation is 80€/person/day.

Only the athletes who comply with the following conditions may take part in a FISU World University Championship:

- a) Be a national of the country they represent;
- b) Be at least 18 and no older than 25 years of age on the 31st December of the year of the event; for 2024, athletes must be born between the 01/01/1999 and the 31/12/2006.

FISU shall receive from each competing country the following FISU registration fees:

- effective member associations of FISU: 20 EUR per athlete and official
- other associations: 40 EUR per athlete and official

The fees will be charged from the participating delegations by FISU.



- General entry (-6 months): January 22, 2024

Competition venue is University of Tartu Sports Hall.





VISIT TARTU



On the swampy plains of Emajõgi River, where the sandy hills that had formed on the area of Tartu made crossing the river easier, a settlement emerged already several centuries ago. The existence of the castle situated on the foreland of Toome dates back to the 5th century, and the discovery site of the settlers of Kunda culture, which lies in the city's current boundaries in Ihaste, could extend Tartu's history even up to 10,000 years. In the old Russian chronicles, Tartu was first mentioned in the year 1030, when the troops of Yaroslav the Wise captured the city. These written sources make Tartu the oldest city in the Baltic States.

By population Tartu is the second largest city in Estonia and is also considered the student capital of Estonia! Tartu is also the cultural capital of Europe 2024 which brings many cultural activities throughout the year.

Tartu has also previously hosted many high level international events including WUC Beach Volleyball, Ski-Orienteering, SELL Games, Powerlifting World Cup
